She also serves as a life coach, guiding women through powerful mindset shifts that help them take charge of their lives mentally, emotionally, and financially. Katherine's mission is to show women, especially those in her age group, that it's possible to be bold, authentic, and step outside of societal norms while building a life of success and fulfillment.
